



Social Media, Marketing, & Communications Internship

The International Leadership Association is now accepting applicants for a **Summer 2019 Social Media, Marketing, & Communications Internship**. The intern will assist with social media campaigns and the development and implementation of marketing initiatives related to ILA conferences and publications. This position also includes an opportunity to write articles for our *Interface* newsletter, highlighting association news and work being done by ILA members. The intern will report directly to the Communications Director and work closely with ILA's staff.

Duration: The internship will take place during the June-August 2019 summer semester. The intern could start earlier and/or stay for longer, if desired. Outstanding performance may lead to hourly employment after the internship ends.

Hours: A typical work week will be 3-5 days for 6-8 hours each day in our Silver Spring, MD office.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Assist with the development and implementation of creative concepts and marketing strategies for promoting our 2019 global conference in Ottawa.
- Research new organizations and individuals we should market our conferences and other products to.
- Coordinate with the Communications Director and possible outside vendors (e.g., graphic artists, printers, etc.) to translate concepts into print, online, and other materials for the various initiatives.
- Develop and write articles of interest for our *Interface* newsletter (e.g., interviews with leadership podcasters, association news on award winners, etc.).
- Update and maintain our social media presence including scheduling Tweets and Facebook updates and posting on LinkedIn, Instagram, and Pinterest.
- Take the lead on short term marketing projects such as a student outreach initiative.

Qualifications:

- Excellent written and interpersonal communication skills.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- Ability to receive feedback, grow, and learn.
- Outstanding work ethic.
- Strong attention to detail.
- Interest in leadership knowledge and practice.
- Ideally, a current undergraduate, graduate student, or recent graduate. We would also consider a recent high school graduate looking for an internship before starting college.
